£450	Employ a specialist Dance teacher	<p>To provide staff the opportunity to work alongside a specialist dance teacher to develop their CPD.</p> <p>To provide a subsidised dance club. We recognise dance promotes a sense of well-being and creativity, it encourages children to be active and healthy, developing motor skills. It allows children to develop their social skills through group activities.</p>	<p>Teachers have gained experience from working with a dance specialist in lessons thus improving their skills and subject knowledge in dance.</p> <p>We have had a good uptake in this club; it has been popular with children in Years 2-4. We are seeing that children are showing respect and corporation for other as they develop their team working skills.</p>
£1425	Provision of transport to a wide range of sporting events e.g. cross country, football, tag-rugby etc.	To provide transport so the children can attend a wider range of sporting events.	Pupils have the opportunity to participate in a wider range of sporting activities. This has encouraged ch'd to attend after school clubs or sporting events outside of school e.g. Curfew Run in Berwick.
£500	Subsidise the Y4 residential trip.	To reduce the cost to parents so more ch'd could participate in the residential trip. The trip includes many outdoor and adventurous activities and develops teamwork.	Nearly all ch'd in Year 4 participated in the residential trip. The children took part in a range of outdoor and adventurous activities developing social skills and team work. Staff noticed more co-

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			operation between individuals.
£360	Provided supply cover for teachers to attend training linked the new P.E. Curriculum.	To release two staff members to attend the 'REAL P.E.' training.	Staff said were more confident developing the children's skills through agility, balance and co-ordination.
£665	Purchase additional sports resources and equipment.	To ensure children are physically active throughout the school day. To promote social skills and to give children the opportunity to learn new games and skills.  To buy additional equipment and replace broken equipment.	Ch'd in Year were trained as playground leaders and are using the equipment to deliver games during playtimes. Playground leaders are showing great commitment to their role in school. We are seeing them taking on their responsibilities wholeheartedly; using their training effectively. They are encouraging younger children to join in with activities and are demonstrating good leadership skills.  All ch'd have access to suitable quality equipment during P.E. lessons and after school clubs.
